PE and Sports Premium Impact Report 2018-19

In 2018-19, the school received £23,533 Sports Premium plus £2,223 Sugar Tax. Total **£25,756**. This money was used to support sustained improvements to the provision of PE and sporting activities for our pupils.

Principles for allocation of PE and Sports Premium at Oxley Primary School:

- Money is spent solely for the purpose of improving provision of PE and Sport in school (increasing levels of participation of physical activity and establishing good habits that will be sustainable in later life).
- Sustainability is achieved through investing in high quality training for teaching staff.
- Pupils need access to specialist coaching in order to maximise the breadth of opportunities available to them.
- Clear accountability for funding so that its use is carefully monitored and the impact tracked.
- Governors are fully involved in decisions about how the premium is allocated and monitored.

Objectives in spending:

- The school aims to increase participation and positive attitudes towards engagement in physical activity for its pupils, particularly through encouraging those who have previously been reluctant to do so.
- To provide high quality CPD for teaching and support staff so that they are able to deliver effective PE and Sports lessons.
- To widen the opportunities for pupils to participate in sports competitions.
- To encourage pupils to adopt healthy lifestyle choices that will sustain them into adulthood, with a particular focus on those pupils who have previously been reluctant to take part or lacked opportunity.
- To provide specialist sports coaching to pupils to improve their skills and develop their enjoyment of a range of sporting and physical activities.

Deployment of specialist Sports Coaches	£813.91	<p>CPD:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Provision of CPD / Training to teaching staff; all teaching staff received a block of training, tailored to their own development needs. Assessment evidence showed an improvement in teachers' skills and confidence. <p>Engagement in Activity: <i>Evidence shows that, for those pupils reluctant to engage in physical activity outside lessons, they do not take part in any physical activity outside school (eg after-school clubs, local sports clubs), in spite of incentives put in place by the school. We therefore concluded that, for these pupils, it was essential to provide access to these activities in the school day – particularly at lunch time.</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Provision of daily lunch-time multi-sports clubs, ensured that all pupils had access to high quality sports and physical activities, games and competitions. There was a high level of participation from all pupils, as clubs were organised that they had requested. Provision of after-school sports clubs – to ensure children have access to a PE / sports activity 5 days a week.

Annual fee for access to sports field	£460	<p>Ensure pupils have access to the sports field (school does not have a field within the grounds) throughout the year. Contribution pays towards the upkeep and painting of markings on the field.</p>
Girls' running club – cost of materials	£146.55	<p>As a result of the girls' running club project, 50 girls in KS2 who had hitherto been reluctant to take part in any running / jogging / endurance activity were supported and encouraged to participate in the club. At the end of the project, all 50 girls increased their stamina and improved significantly their self confidence and attitudes towards running.</p>
